Interactive Potawatomi Language Learning Program on CD-ROM

The Potawatomi Cultural Center and Museum along with Grey Fox Productions, a Native American-owned company, have partnered in creating an executable stand-alone program (a program that performs as a self-contained package) implemented for Windows XP and MAC OS X systems.

The program, with assistance from James Thunder, will be an interactive that will have animated graphics that, when clicked upon, will result in audible cues to the user to assist in learning the Potawatomi language.

The program, named after our own

tribal pre-school, will have five themes:

- 1) In the Classroom
- 2) At Mealtime
- 3) Outside Activities
- 4) Matching Games
- 5) Text Only, which is comprised of all terminology used on the CD-ROM.

The project is expected to take 30 weeks for completion.
