By Virtue of the Authority Invested in the Court Under Section 1.04 of the Forest County Tribal Court Code, the Following Is Hereby Promulgated as Rule of the Court, Order Number 7, Subpoenas: Issuance, Service, Witness Fees and Milage in the Forest County Tribal Courts, effective this date:

**Authorization for the Issuance
and Signature of Subpoenas**

The Clerk of Court shall issue Subpoenas upon request. The Clerk is hereby delegated the authority to sign the Subpoenas on behalf of the Court.

**Authorization For
Service of Subpoenas**

Section 1.08 B. of the Forest County Potawatomi Tribal Court Code governing service of legal documents provides as follows:

"Only authorized Tribal law enforcement personnel shall make personal service on the reservation, except as may be otherwise ordered by the Court. Personal service off the reservation may be made by any adult person."

To date no Tribal law enforcement agency has been established and there are no Tribal law enforcement personnel. Accordingly, in order to facilitate the service of legal documents from the Tribal Court, until further order of the Court, any adult person may serve Forest County Potawatomi Tribal Court legal documents both on and off the Forest County Potawatomi Reservation by complying with the provisions set forth in Section 1.08 of the Tribal Court Code.


The person serving a subpoena shall make a Certificate of Service and return it to the office of the Clerk of Court together with the original of the subpoena being served, and leave a copy of said subpoena with the person who was served.

Witness Fees and Milage

Witness fees and milage shall be tendered to the person being subpoenaed at the time of service of the subpoena. Witness fees shall be \$25.00 per day or any part thereof, and milage shall be at the rate of Thirty (.30) cents per mile round trip from the witness's residence to the Tribal Center.
