Newly-Elected FCP Chairman Is Sworn In

Surrounded by family and community, newly-elected FCP Chairman James A. Crawford was sworn in by Chief Judge Christian D. Daniels on Feb. 13, 2023, in the FCP Tribal Courtroom.

Crawford has served as a member of the Potawatomi tribal leadership on multiple occasions. He served as vice chairman from 2010 to 2012, and executive council member from 2013 to 2015. Most recently, he served as secretary from 2016 to 2022.

He said after the swearing-in, "I have been on this Council for many years of my life, and I have to say this is probably the first time I am nervous during a swearing-in since the first time back in 2010. I know there are big shoes I have to fill in this role. It gives me great honor to follow in the footsteps of my Uncle Art and Dad James Crawford who also served as tribal chairmen for our tribe. It is very humbling to be elected as the tribal chairman, and I look forward to working hard for our people."

After Crawford was sworn-in, Tribal Elders Phil and Brenda Shopodock gave some words of wisdom and blessings to Crawford as he partakes on his new journey in life. He was also gifted an eagle feather and medicines from the Shopodock's which meant a great deal to him.

One closing remark from Crawford was, "I'm looking forward to continuing that momentum and doing more great things for our people."

He also wanted to thank Chairman Daniels for all that he did for the tribe. Crawford quoted from another source saying, "I'm extremely grateful for the many years that Chairman Daniels spent leading our tribe. He successfully led us through some of the most challenging times the tribe has ever faced and put us in a strong position to continue moving forward. 'Chi Migwéth' for all he gave the Potawatomi people."

Congratulations to Chairman Crawford and best wishes on the path ahead!

FEB 20 - MAR 21

- The black bear species can be other colors than black
- Mostly a solitary species
- Mating season is late May to mid-June, but eggs don't implant until fall before sows den up
 - Allows their body to build reserves over summer and then “assess” if they have enough to produce young without stressing the sow too much
- Bears can live up to 30 years old in the wild, but most make it to their early 20s

Potawatomi Business Development Corporation: **OPENING DOWNTOWN**

MILWAUKEE OFFICE

Potawatomi Business Development Corp. in February will move into a prominent space in the 833 East office in downtown Milwaukee as it seeks to grow a number of subsidiary ventures involved in real estate, electric vehicles and a new convenience store brand.

The company signed a five-year lease for 18,357 square feet in the lakefront building's fourth floor. Its entrance is off of the multi-tenant office's main lobby, giving the Forest County Potawatomi Community's business development corporation a more visible presence in Milwaukee.

"One emphasis we have as a company over the coming years is to get PBDC more into the Milwaukee business community," said CEO Randy Mueller. "Everybody who goes in that building will see our offices."

The Potawatomi Community's business development corporation has created and grown a number of subsidiary businesses, including builder Greenfire Management Services, a federal government contractor, and a data center.

"Our expansion into the 833 East building is solely driven by growth in our other subsidiary companies," Mueller said. "We've run out of space in our current offices."

The corporation since 2011 has been based in the Wgema Campus on Milwaukee's near west side, and will keep some operations there. The new 833 East office will open in mid-February, and will house about 42 people.

That future home in 833 East is the former headquarters of the building's developer, Irgens, which is moving this month to one of its recently completed office buildings at UWM's Innovation Campus in Wauwatosa.

"Having PBDC join the tenant roster at 833 East brings us a high-quality occupier, which further enhances our project," said Mark Irgens, Irgens CEO and manager.

The growing PBDC subsidiaries that will be based in the downtown space include Sagewind Development, a real estate firm that is pursuing project opportunities in southeast Wisconsin. Andy Wiegman, a 20-year veteran of the industry, is leading Sagewind.

Its first project is the redevelopment of the former Dairyland Greyhound Park in Kenosha. Dubbed "Greenway," it is a partnership with Milwaukee-based Zilber Property Group. The two firms will convert the former greyhound racing track property into new uses that include apartments and a business park with industrial buildings.

Sagewind Development is seeking approvals from Kenosha's Common Council in early February that would clear the way for infrastructure construction to start, Mueller said. Heartland Produce Co. has already purchased land in Greenway for a new building. Future phases will include four industrial buildings and about 260 apartments, Mueller said.

"At the same time, we're out looking for other development projects," he said of Sagewind.

The Potawatomi corporation is also launching a business in the electric vehicle space that will focus on installing, maintaining and serving charging stations, Mueller said. While there are manufacturers that make and install the equipment, fewer specialize in maintaining it over time, he said.

"The (EV) market is big, it's diverse, it's fast growing," he said. "It's hard to pick a place where you would really like to enter the market."

That EV company is earlier in the growth process, and hasn't yet been branded, or started a first project. Mueller said PBDC is seeking an opportunity to acquire an existing electrical contractor that already performs work on charging stations to help launch the business.
