The Forest County Potawatomi (FCP) community hosted their Winter's End Powwow on March 25 - 26, 2023, at the Potawatomi Community Center. The weekend was full of celebrations of the winter coming to an end, and many communities came together to pass on generations of traditions.

One tradition that takes place year after year the Friday before the main events is the royalty contest. It took place on Friday, March 24, 2023. The Potawatomi youth compete to represent the FCP community throughout the year as they travel to powwows in Indian Country. Senior Princess, Junior Princes and Brave are chosen based off dance and interview. It's an honor to represent the FCP community's prestigious title as they travel with identifiable sashes and crowns to show other communities where they come from and who they are as young Indigenous people with strong ancestry and cultural backgrounds.

2023-2024 Winters End Royalty chosen were Senior Princess Lovey Van-Zile, Junior Princess Jayla Frank, and Brave Brody White.

Winter's End Powwow is an annual event that is open to everyone. Families can get together to show off new dance moves and friends come to catch up with one another. Drummers and singers come from all parts of the U.S. and Canada. It's a really good time to meet new friends, search for some new gear with the vendors or to grab some frybread and cultural food at the stands.

This year's line up consisted of the host drum Bear Creek and local host drum Fire Nation. In attendance was co-host drum Smokeytown, invited drums were Young Enemy, Meskwaki Nation and Pipestone. The drum groups made the powwow arena feel like a living being with a heartbeat that radiated a feeling of happiness for everyone. Seeing the brotherhood of drummers and backup singers sing/drum for their communities is inspiring, and to know that good thoughts and prayers were sang for all.

While the drum groups brought life to the arena, MC Keveon Kingbird along with Co-MC Joey Awonohopay made sure information was announced with good old Native American humor and entertainment. Arena Director Dana Warrington did a great job attending to everyone to make sure the agenda went as planned. It was an honor to see the men and women that have served our country carry in our flags and staff during each grand entry. We had

impressive representation from Head Veteran Bruce Shepard, Head Male Dancer Johnathan Johnson and Head Female Dancer Waleli Frank.

Dancers showed up in crowds. Some danced to heal their spirits, others danced to pray for loved ones that can no longer dance. No matter the reason for being out in the arena, the smallest tiny tots to the highly-respected elderly showed the community what it meant to be Native American in Forest County. Traditional generational values were represented in dance styles and the variety of regalia. It was an exciting and beautiful weekend of observance for the new season to come.

Pharmacist Lisa Petrack, Registered Nurse Misty Curleyhair, Prevention and Recovery Program Manger Angela Jacobson were the trainers during these sessions with Health Division Central Supply Coordinator Blaine Rosek shadowing to become a trainer as well.






