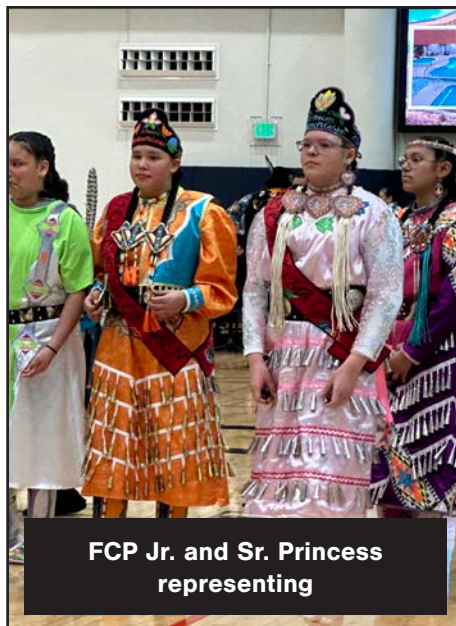

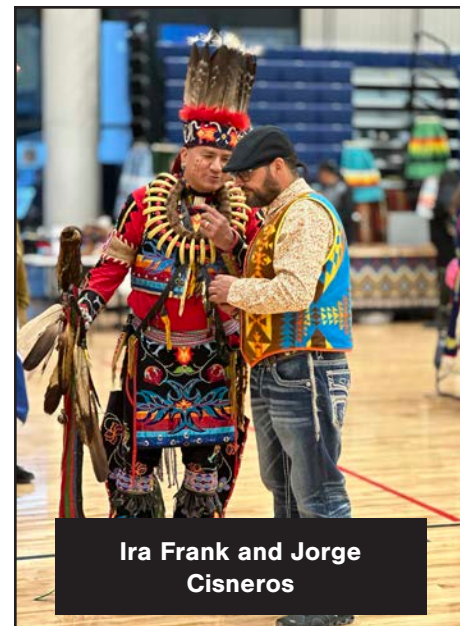

It was a special day for the tribe’s Chief Financial Officer Kevin Hanson on Dec. 21, 2023, who was hanging up his “coat” after working for the Forest County Potawatomi for 17 years.

Hanson accomplished some key highlights during his time here working with the tribe. He worked with four tribal treasures during his years and played a key role in securing the financing for several large capital projects, including Potawatomi Hotel & Casino expansions in Milwaukee. He created policies for the tribe’s investments, including the minor’s trust. When the Covid pandemic shut down the tribe’s casinos, and per capita payments halted, he found a way to provide relief to tribal members through various grants and savings. These are just a few highlights that Hanson accomplished in his time here, among many others.

“Hanson was brilliant and could answer any question you had off the

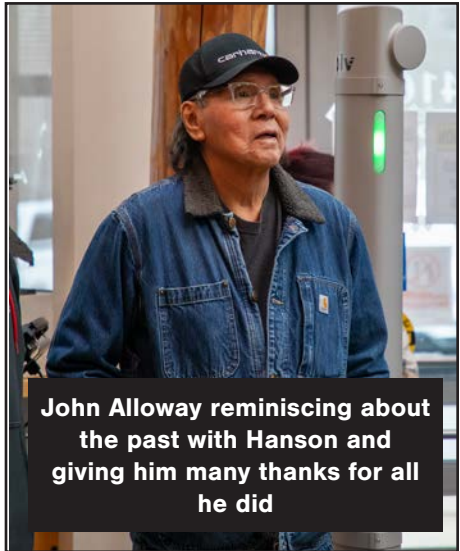
top-of-his-head, including exact dates and dollar amounts”, one employee spoke of him. The person continued to state, “He was also very humble and hated to be the center of attention. He could always explain very complicated things in a way that was easy for everyone to understand; he was laid back and extremely easy to work with. You always knew when he was coming down the hallway with a hum in his voice; we will miss him terribly!”

The impact Hanson had not only on the tribe as a businessman but also the impact he had on tribal members as a person who cared was felt on the day of his farewell. Several tribal members spoke to Hanson, recognizing him for all the efforts he made for their tribal people, especially their tribal youth and future generations. He was gifted a handmade war club, but Richard Gougé, Phil and Brenda Shopodock gave thanks and for everything he had done with a tear or two; Chairman Crawford spoke highly

of how Hanson was always on top of any situation and gifted him a blanket on behalf of the tribe, both Treasurer Manny Johnson and Vice Chairwoman Heather VanZile gave some fun memories to relive and their gratitude. FCP elder Eugene Shawano Sr. and Eugene Shawano Jr. spoke to Hanson with kind words and acknowledgments of his time here with the tribe. Another who showed extreme gratitude and congratulations to Hanson was John Alloway, among other members and co-workers. You could really feel the impact and love that was given to Hanson on this special day from so many. Hanson certainly left his mark on the community, and many will miss him dearly.

Congratulations, Kevin, and thank

you for all you have done here for Forest County Potawatomi. Enjoy your time of relaxation - you deserve it!

**FCP Youth Sports Performance Coach:** Eric K. Dixon, Youth Athletic Coach at Potawatomi Community Center

**Sports Coaching Background:** Coach Dixon has coached athletics, speed, agility and strength training for over 45 years in various sporting events. He has coached many U.S. nationally-ranked youth athletes and world/American masters record holders. He’s also coached athletes who’ve competed for Italy and India’s National/Olympics youth and adult teams.

Coach Dixon is certified to coach elite youth and adult athletes for National/International/Olympic level competitions via U.S.A. Track & Field (USATF) and the World Athletics Federation. He also holds several certifications in Sports Strength and Conditioning Training.

He’s an Instructor for U.S.A. Track & Field Coaches Education Programs

and an instructor for Nike’s North-west Track & Field Coaches Clinics. He has developed sports performance education programs for athletes and coaches in multiple countries.

Reason why Coach Dixon is here in his own words, “In Forest County, I’m looking to develop a Youth Sports program to get our athletes up to the elite level of sports competition. I know we have the genetics/DNA to reach the highest levels of college athletics and beyond; however, if we don’t use it after several generations, we will lose it. My focus is to allow our kids to achieve their full sports potential.

Of course, this takes a holistic approach from everyone in the community. Therefore, I’m looking to build a sports education program to get everyone (coaches, parents and athletes) on the same page with current sports science, performance and development, youth through adults. The objective is to build up our athletes to their highest level and not burn them out physically, psychologically, and neurologically.

This takes a holistic approach as it’s not just about sports development. The more fit our culture is, the fewer health problems we will have with future generations, fit for life philosophy.

In the future, I would like to have a sports training complex that we can use to develop our athletes fully in the Indian Country. In addition, I would like to have internal sports competing in all sports within the Indian Country.”
